Changes to the COVID-19 Safety Since 05/10/2021

- Face mask and social distancing procedures were updated in accordance with CDC recommendations. Those who are fully vaccinated can gather indoors with other fully vaccinated people without wearing a mask or staying 6 feet apart. Masks will still be required while practicing procedures on other people in the Dental Assisting, Medical Assistant and Nursing programs.
 - You are considered fully vaccinated 2 weeks after a second dose in a 2-dose series such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine or 2 weeks after a single=does vaccines such as the Johnson and Johnson vaccine.
 - Charter College will not be requiring Students, Staff, or faculty to provide proof of vaccination thus each individual must determine what course of action is best for them and their specific needs.
- Temperature checks are no longer required to enter campuses in the States of California, Montana and New Mexico. Faculty, Students and Staff are still required to abstain from coming to campus if they are experiencing any symptoms identified below including a fever.
- Capacity restrictions for the New Mexico Campus has been changed from 75% to 100%

- The Associate of Applied Science in Nursing program will hold all Nursing and Science Lab courses on campus. Nursing Clinical courses will be held in person at the assigned location or in the campus Simulation lab. All Nursing, Science and General Education Lectures will be conducted online via Microsoft Teams.

Washington

During any face-to-face instruction on campus at schools located in Washington the following conditions will be met to mitigate the risk to students and faculty:

- Temperature checks will be conducted prior to entering the campus.
 - o Anyone with a temperature of 100.4 or higher will not be allowed to enter the campus.
- A COVID-19 Supervisor has been assigned at every location to monitor the health of the
 employees and students and enforce the COVID-19 Safety plan; a Supervisor will be available
 anytime the campus is open.
- A mandatory COVID-19 Safety Training will be conducted in the beginning of each face-to-face class. The training will explain the protective measures in place.
- All persons are encouraged to wear face masks in accordance with that State's Department of
 Health guidelines, covering the nose and mouth while on campus. Masks are required while
 practicing procedures on other people in the Dental Assisting, Medical Assistant and Nursing lab
 sessions.
- The College will frequently disinfect common touch surfaces such as door handles, desks, chairs, equipment, restrooms, and other common surfaces.
- The College encourages frequent handwashing for all students, staff, and faculty. The College requires handwashing at the beginning and end of instruction, before and after going to the bathroom, before and after eating, and after coughing, sneezing, or blowing their nose.
- Hand sanitizer (60%+ ethanol or 70%+ isopropanol) will be available throughout the campus.
- Appropriate social distancing is encouraged while on campus.
- Maximum class sizes have been adjusted to ensure appropriate social distancing.
- All students, staff, and faculty with COVID-19 symptoms are required to stay home until cleared to return to school; See the next bullet point for clearance details. The following are considered to be COVID-19 symptoms.

 - Temperature at or above 100 degrees Fahrenheit
 - o Fever
 - o Chills
 - Muscle or body aches

 - o cleared by a physician or
 - o test negative and are 24 hours symptom free prior to returning or
 - o test positive, quarantine for 10 days and are 24 hours symptom free prior to returning.
- Students, Faculty or Staff who have been tested for COVID for any reason, must stay home until the results are available. Students notify your instructors and academic advisor to be cleared to return to campus. Faculty and Staff notify Human Resources to be cleared to return to campus.
- Staff, faculty, or students who fail to comply with any of the above will be sent home.

Alaska, California, Montana, and New Mexico

During any face-to-face instruction on campus at schools located in Alaska, California, Montana, or New Mexico the following conditions will be met to mitigate the risk to students and faculty:

- All persons are encouraged to wear face masks in accordance with the State's Department of Health and Social Services guidelines, covering the nose and mouth while on campus or in shared spaces like hallways and bathrooms. Masks are required while practicing procedures on other people in the Dental Assisting, Medical Assistant and Nursing lab sessions. (<u>Note</u>: This change does not go into effect for the California Campuses until June 15th)
- The College will disinfect common touch surfaces such as door handles, desks, chairs, equipment, restrooms, and other common surfaces frequently.
